/ONLINE WARMUP FOR EVERYONE FEB 19****

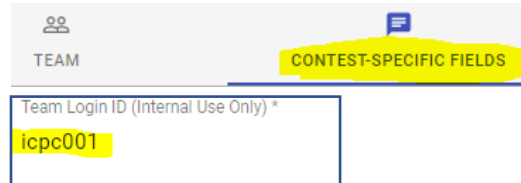

Download the Development Environment

The primary purpose of the rehearsal is to teach the contest web interface, and to demonstrate the Fedora 35 contest-day development system. We recommend downloading the Fedora appliance for development and running your code the way the judges run solution submissions. The appliance was tested under VirtualBox 6.1.

How Many Teams Can a School Send?

Our host, Riverside Community College, can accommodate about 55 teams onsite this year (COVID considerations). For all schools with multiple teams requesting onsite competition, we will accept the first eligible team from each school, then the second, etc., until the site is full. Schools may opt to set up Proctored sites for all their teams, or for "overflow" teams. Teams that wish to compete and cannot come on site or do not have a proctored team option may compete in a non-proctored division.
